POST-DOCTORAL position available to work with the Emory Global Diabetes Research Center (EGDRC) led by Dr. K.M. Venkat Narayan, Ruth and O.C. Hubert Professor of Global Health and Epidemiology in the Hubert Department of Global Health, Rollins School of Public Health, Emory University, Atlanta, USA.

The Emory Global Diabetes Research Center has established partnerships with significant collaborators in diabetes and cardiovascular disease (CVD) research in the US and globally. As a result, Fellows will be involved in large and innovative observational and intervention studies of diabetes and CVD etiology, prevention, and treatment. Fellows will also have the opportunity to work with a number of faculty at EGDRC (e.g., Drs. Mary Beth Weber, Mohammed Ali, Solveig Cunningham and others). Exciting scientific challenges and opportunities for career progression are available for motivated, high quality candidates.

Research activities will include working with an international team to plan and implement a multi-center worksite implementation research intervention for diabetes prevention and management at eight worksites in India. Specific tasks may include preparing study protocols, designing data collection tools, overseeing junior researchers, and data analysis (qualitative and/or quantitative data). In addition, the fellow will have the opportunity to work with other EGDRC investigators on other projects which could include grant writing, systematic reviews, data analyses, complex modeling related to diabetes and cardiovascular disease interventions and their impact, globally; and writing of publications for peer-reviewed journals.

We are seeking candidates with a medical or doctoral degree in epidemiology, nutrition, behavioral sciences, or related health field with substantive knowledge of diabetes, obesity, and CVD. Candidates must have strong quantitative and/or qualitative background; the ability to work independently and collaboratively; strong organizational and record keeping skills; fluent English writing and verbal skills; and inter-disciplinary attitude.

Emory University's unique partnerships with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, CARE, the Carter Center, the Task Force for Child Survival and Development, and global health organizations around the world make Emory one of the nation's leading universities for both research and practice. The Rollins School of Public Health comprises six academic departments: global health, behavioral sciences and health education, biostatistics, environmental and occupational health, epidemiology, and health policy and management, and hosts over 20 interdisciplinary centers. The Hubert Department of Global Health hosts many international fellows, including Humphrey, Foege, Fogarty, and Fulbright fellows.
